Shropshire Council Financial Emergency

You may by now be aware that Shropshire Council has declared a 'Financial Emergency' as a result of the forecast for Q4 of the current financial year. The shortfall is circa £900,000 and whilst this may not appear to be a huge amount of money, it would put SC in an illegal financial position by end of year. The Declaration facilitates emergency measures to bring us back into a legal financial position by March. This must happen as the result of maintaining this illegal position would be the imposition of a 'Section 114', whereby external administrators come into the council to impose drastic cuts to non-statutory services such as libraries and leisure centres. I shall be attending Cabinet this week to gain greater understanding of the circumstances and potential remedial measures. Rest assured, I will be doing my best to represent the needs of Upton Magna and the other parishes of Tern in the coming months.

600 House Development by Battlefield Roundabout

I have been made aware by my Battlefield colleague of a huge proposal by Manor Oak Homes to build 600 houses by the Battlefield roundabout. Clearly, with the ongoing chronic shortage of critical infrastructure and services around North and East Shrewsbury, this plan should raise concerns for the nearby parishes. This land had originally been earmarked for commercial development, however the applicant is attempting to gain a change of use. I believe an Environmental Impact Assessment has been undertaken with the result being a determination of no impact. We are still waiting for the developer to submit a 'Pre- Application' before we can bring you any more information. As more information becomes available I will of course share it, but in the meantime I would encourage awareness of this among your residents.

Memorandum of Understanding for Town and Parish Councils

You should hopefully be in receipt of this document from Councillor Alex Wagner. Please give it due consideration and I look forward to hearing what you might hope to get out of this proposed realignment in the relationship between the PC and SC so I can best support you in achieving a satisfactory outcome for Upton Magna.

Site Visits

I am reaching out to all of the parishes in Tern to arrange site visits to see for myself the most pressing Highways and Infrastructure concerns. I have a list of Highways concerns from the last meeting such as the Haughmond Hill Double Yellows and the Haughton Crossroads and I would be very grateful if a member of the PC could walk the ground with me at these sites so that I can gain some context and take some photographs.

Uffington and Upton Magna BESS Sites

There has been no word on when these will come before the Northern Planning Committee. My understanding is that the planning period has been extended, pending further detail being submitted by the applicants. As I highlighted previously, neither of these applicants have submitted detailed specifications for the safety- critical battery cell and battery management components. In a Member's question to the last Full Council meeting, I did highlight that there are to date, no British Standards for this equipment so hopefully the Planning Officers are taking this into consideration...
